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The Single Market

The EU operates as a **single market**, allowing free movement of :

- **goods**
- **services**
- **capital**
- **people**



This is known as the “**Four Freedoms**”

The single market reduces: tariffs, border controls, legal barriers, trade restrictions.

Most EU countries export between **50% and 80%** of their goods to other EU members.



Advantages of European Economic Integration

- larger common market
- lower prices through competition
- increased investment
- easier business expansion
- stronger bargaining power globally.

Social and Political Benefits

- peace and stability
- free movement for citizens
- educational programs like Erasmus+
- stronger international cooperation.



Challenges of Integration



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Despite successes, integration also creates challenges:

- economic inequality between regions
- debt crises
- migration pressures
- disagreements on sovereignty
- different fiscal policies among states.

Research shows that **integration has increased trade and openness**, but economic benefits are not equally distributed across all regions
